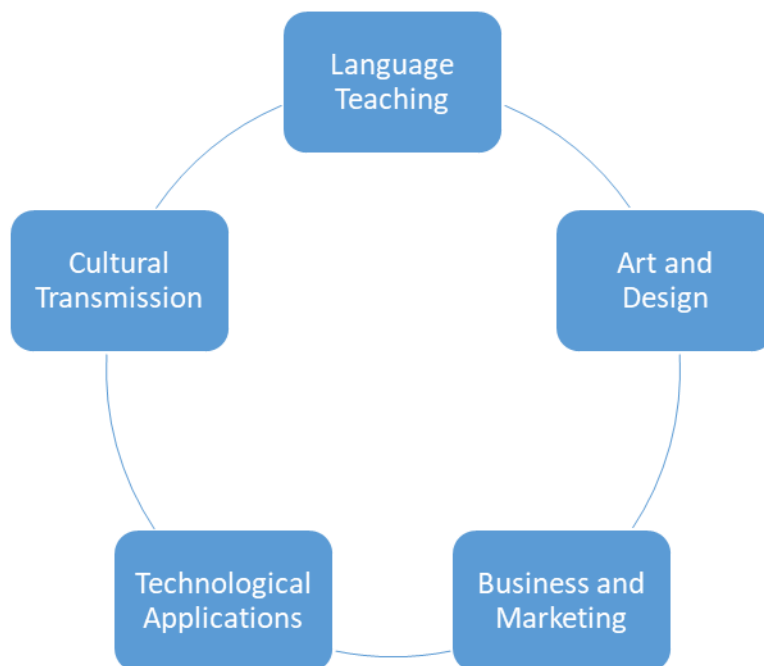


Figure 1: application

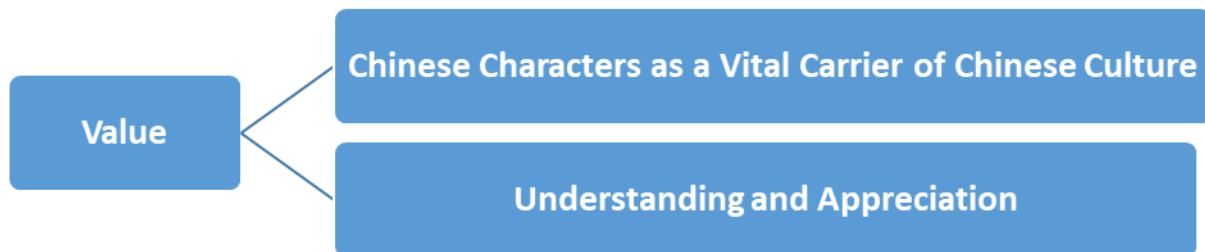


Figure 2: Value

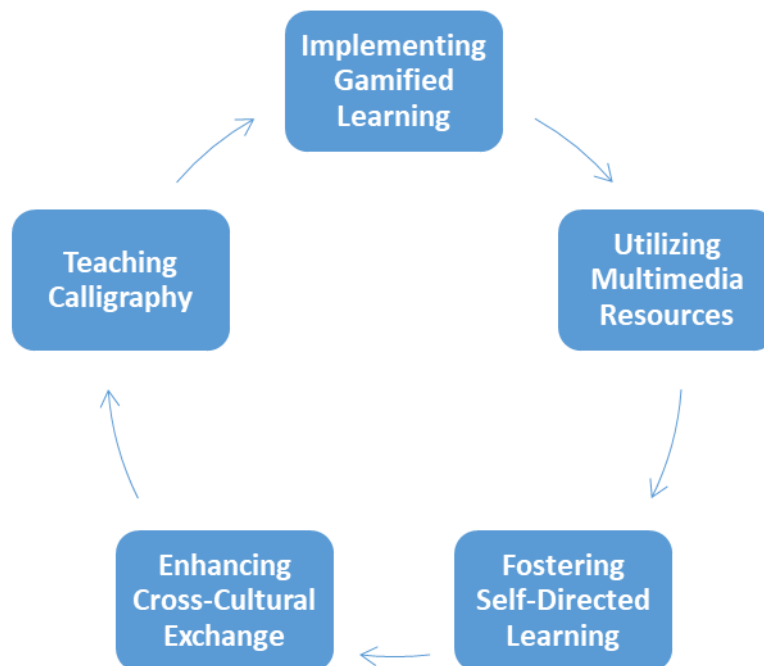


Figure 3: Innovating Teaching Methods to Enhance the Effectiveness
